CURRENT STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS

A statute of limitations is a state law passed to set the maximum time after an event within which legal proceedings can occur.

Each state has a different statute of limitations, so if you had a crime committed against you in different statutes, you will have different statutes.

The current statutes of limitations for sexual assault in **Pennsylvania** are:

If you have been abused *after* 2019 and you are under 18, you can report no matter how many years go by.

If you were abused *before* 2019, and you were under 18 at the time, you can report until you are 50 years old.

If you are 24 years or older at the time of your assault, you have 12 years from the date of the offense to seek remedies.

A historical report documents evidence against an offender that can help in ongoing or future investigations for law enforcement and the prosecutors office.
